Masdar is a small city-only 2.3 square miles (6 sq. km). In the future, it will hold 50,000 people, more than 1,000 companies, and a university. Its streets are very narrow. The houses are close to each other. The shade from the houses helps keep the streets cool.

There are no cars on the streets of Masdar. Because the city is so small, people can walk to most places. If they get tired, they can use the PRT: Personal Rapid Transit. These small, solar-powered cars move underground, like a subway. The cars have no drivers.

People just tell the car where they want to go, and it takes them there. Masdar will reuse as many resources as possible. It will reuse about 80 percent of its water and change most of its waste3 into more energy. People in Masdar are even using building materials that they can reuse in the future.


